## St. Vladimir Church Donating Directives

#### ✓ What are the financial requirements of a voting member?

The parish of St. Vladimir requires financial resources in order to exist. We must pay for things like building rent and upkeep, liturgical supplies, and our priest's salary. In addition, we give 10% of our monthly income to the OCA Archdiocese of Canada. This tithe stays in Canada. This is all documented in the monthly financial statements which are available to everyone. We ask that voting members familiarize themselves with and contribute to these financial needs. We do not have parish dues, nor do we wish to become dependant on fundraising. The norm of Christian giving is the tithe, i.e. 10% of one's income. If one is not already tithing one should be working toward this norm. Below is a guide to proportional giving:

#### ✓ How do I donate to St. Vladimir Orthodox Church?

#### ✓ How do I donate to a specific fund?

If you want to direct your offering to a specific fund or project, simply write the name of the fund on your offering's envelope or include a note. Cheques to be designated to these funds are still made out to "St. Vladimir Orthodox Church," and the donations are tax deductible.

#### ✓ What about tax receipts?

Charitable donations to our parish are tax deductible. In order to receive a tax receipt for your gift, please place it in an envelope labeled with your name; personal cheques do not require an envelope.
